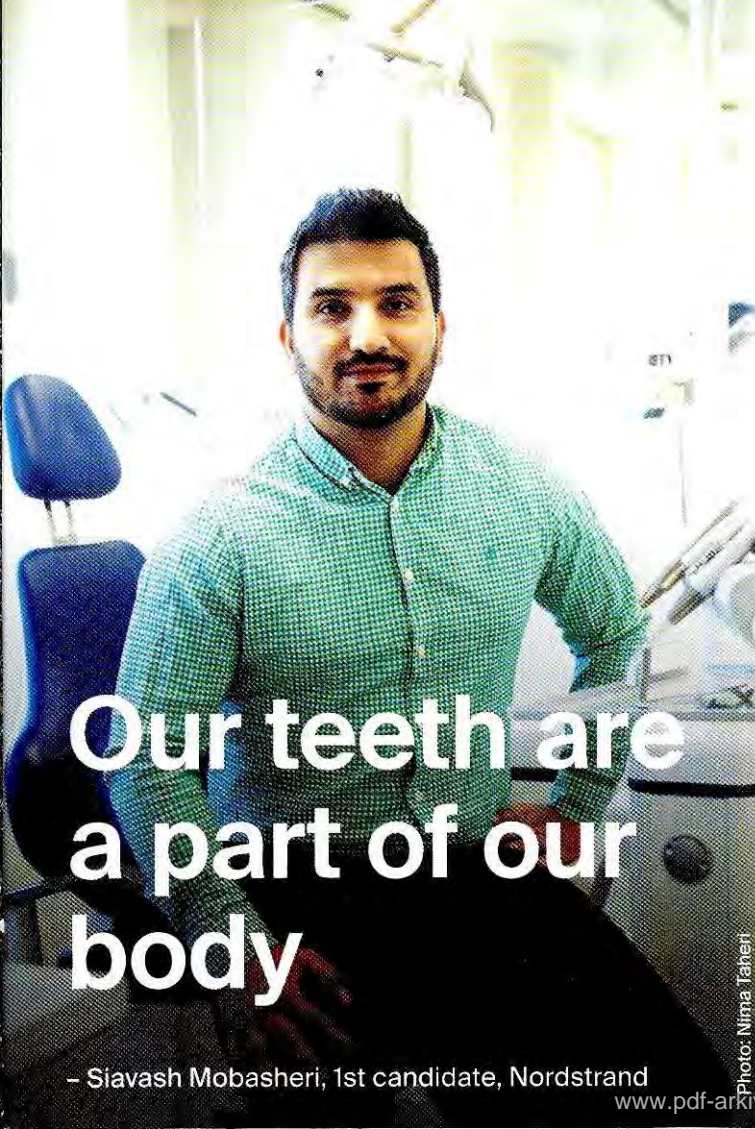

Struggling against a divided Oslo

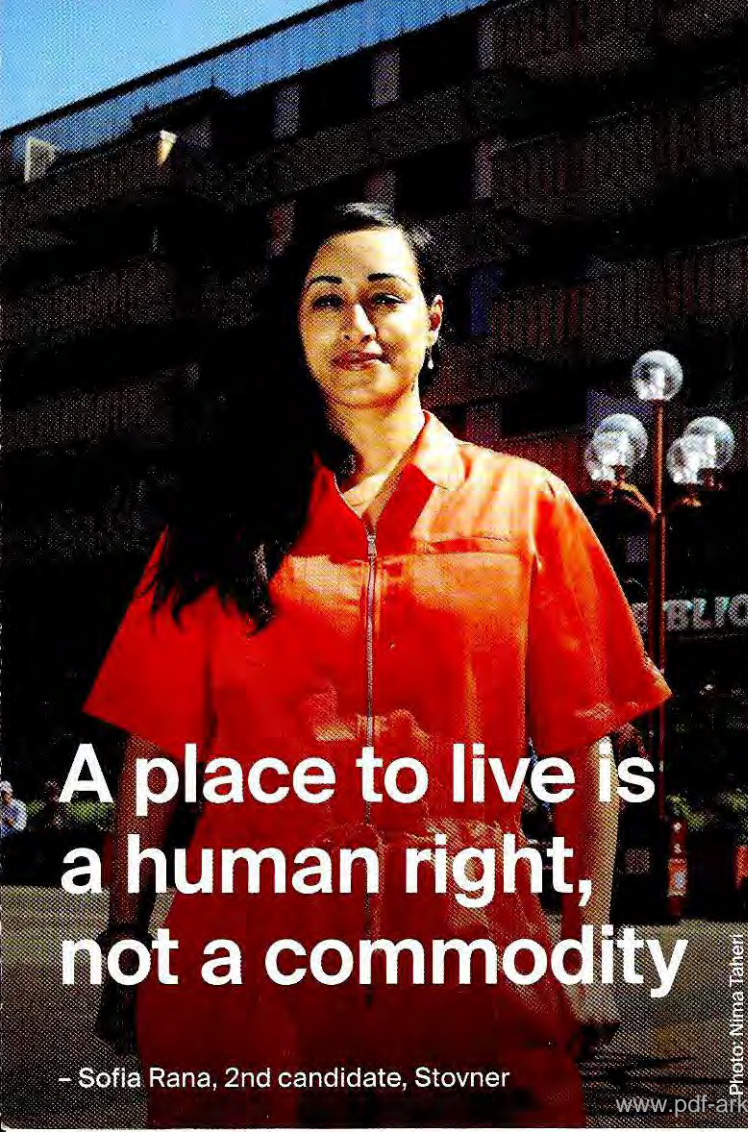

Everyone has the right to a good home at a reasonable price

A home is a human right, but has gone from being a safe place to live, to becoming something that speculators, developers and landlords make profits from. The market doesn't work. We need to take back control. Oslo must have room for everyone, including people with ordinary income and less wealth

THE RED PARTY STRIVES FOR:

- lower rents in municipal housing. The market rent must be done away with. The rents must be in accordance with the residents' income
- building more municipal housing and more non-commercial housing, both for ownership and rentals
- stricter control of rental properties. We want to put an end to under par apartments and anti-social landlords
- a humane urban development. We need parks, schools and kindergartens, cultural and sports facilities in place before people move in.

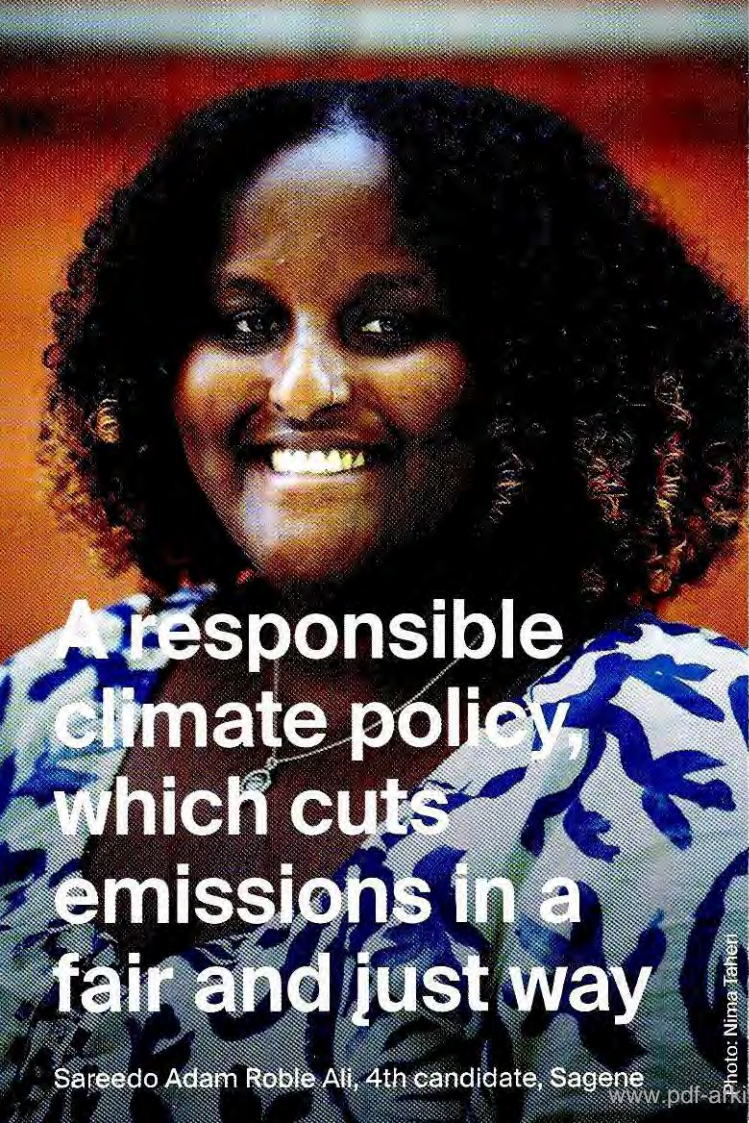

Welfare is not a business

People should know that they will get help when they need it. The private sector makes money from welfare by exploiting the employees' working conditions, wages and pensions. Worsening the working conditions means worse conditions for both preschoolers and pensioners. In cooperation with the trade union movement, the Red Party has achieved that the municipality is now running the nursing homes, new preschools, janitorial services, and renovation.

THE RED PARTY STRIVES FOR:

- a "welfare city" with permanent, full-time jobs and enough people at the work place – without having to use private temporary agencies.
- that the buses, like the subway and the trams, must be managed and driven by the city
- that schools, nursing homes and other municipal organizations must employ their own cleaning staff
- dignified elderly care. The elderly must be granted a place in a nursing home when they want it.

A fair and just environmental policy

A city for everyone must take the climate and environmental crisis seriously. We must reduce emissions, pollution and inequality – at the same time. Oslo must become fossil-fuel-free by 2030 and a zero-emissions city by 2040. The battle for the environment can never be won without the support of the large majority. We cannot send the bill from the costs of this battle to those who have the least. It must become easier and cheaper to live in an environmentally friendly way.

THE RED PARTY STRIVES FOR:

- a monthly travel card at a maximum of NOK 500. A single ticket must last 3 hours.
- major investment in energy-saving and solar cells on rooves – both those belonging to the municipality, the households and the businesses.
- preserving the beachside zone and to reopen more streams. We must maintain Oslo's forests, and have playgrounds and parks where people live.
- A wildlife bridge over the E6 at Furuset and a short tunnel under Manglerud. Trondheimsveien must become a "green street" with lower speed limits and less traffic.
